HISTORY OF DECA IN NORTH DAKOTA

As the Distributive Education Program developed, the professional members directly involved in the activities of the student of DE felt that additional curricular activity was needed to supplement the program itself. Students in Distributive Education did not have the opportunity to develop their potential in other extra-curricular or co-curricular activities within the school district because they attended school in the morning and were released from school early to go to work. For the purposes of developing a respect for education in marketing and distribution and of promoting leadership and understanding of the responsibilities of citizenship in this country, the teacher-coordinators in North Dakota organized, in 1953, at Valley City High School on April 10th to form the North Dakota Association of DECA.

It was voluntary to have clubs and two of the larger cities did not have clubs. A state charter was received at the eighth Annual National Convention of DECA in San Antonio, Texas, April 25-28, 1954.

PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of DECA is to develop respect for education which will contribute to occupational competence, and to promote understanding and appreciation for the responsibilities of citizenship in our free, competitive enterprise system.

1. Assisting state associations in their growth and development of DECA.
2. Providing awards and recognition for youths who demonstrate outstanding qualities in marketing, merchandising and management skills.
3. Encouraging students to participate in an organized school activity (DECA) thus giving them an opportunity to develop responsibilities of leadership and citizenship.
4. Giving members a chance to learn and serve as both leaders and followers, and to offer the opportunity for state and national recognition that they might not have otherwise.
5. Maintaining DECA activities as school-centered, thus contributing to the school's purpose of preparing well-adjusted, employable citizens.
6. Working with business interests to upgrade student employment with interested firms.

What is DECA?

DECA identifies the Program of Youth Activity relating to Marketing Education. It is designed to develop future leaders for Marketing Education. The organization is non-profit, non-political, school centered and totally youth oriented. All chapters are self-supporting, with members paying local, state, and national dues. It is the only national youth organization operating in the nation's schools to attract young people to careers in marketing education.

Marketing Education was first organized in 1937, but it was not until 1948 that various DECA Chapters joined together and adopted the official name of Distributive Education Clubs of America. At that time, there were 17 charter states with a total membership of 793. From this beginning, DECA has grown to over 125,000 members annually in 4,000 school chapters.

Marketing Education prepares our high school and college students for rewarding careers in marketing, management, and entrepreneurship. DECA enhances that education ... by providing marketing related activities and leadership development based directly on classroom study. DECA's activities focus on competition, on the local, state and national level, in specific occupational skills, leadership development and management training.

The objective of both marketing education and DECA is to teach marketing and management skills in such diversified career areas as food marketing, hotel management, restaurant marketing and management, department and specialty store retailing, industrial and international marketing, finance and credit, advertising, insurance, wholesaling, and entrepreneurship. The curriculum is tailored to specific career goals of students but includes basic scholastic and communication skills human relations and employability skills.

Students are taught the fundamentals of marketing and management as well as the principles of economics and free enterprise through classroom instruction, on the job training, and DECA activities.

In every state, four territories, the District of Columbia and Canada, DECA offers students the opportunity to excel and to be recognized for their achievements in marketing education.

DECA's student divisions - High School, and Delta Epsilon Chi at the college level - are student organizations specifically created to provide teaching / learning experiences to be used both in and out of the classroom. DECA is not extracurricular. Recognized by the state boards of education and by federal legislation, DECA is an integral part of the marketing education instructional program.

DECA is one of the best examples of the business community working cooperatively to create a well-trained, educated work force from which business can draw future managers and marketing personnel. It is a relationship of mutual benefit.

Marketing Education exists because business demands that it exist. As global economic competition intensifies, a growing emphasis will be placed on education - particularly management and marketing education.

History has proven that a nation prospers in direct proportion to the educational level of its workers, managers and leaders. America is in a struggle for world economic and political leadership. Marketing education and DECA are effective weapons for this struggle.

PUBLICATIONS

The NEW DIMENSIONS has been published for and about DECA members since it replaced the DECA Distributor, which started in 1947. It is intended to inform the membership trends and activity in Marketing and Distributive Education and provides a vehicle for member ideas in different areas of activity. Newsletters and other publications are circulated to all chapters. The newsletter is primarily concerned with news, which affects the chapters on a state or national level. One key publication, which is a must for all progressive chapters and individuals in the DECA Handbook. It clarifies the educational advantages of DECA chapter activity, suggests procedures for local chapter improvement and development, and aids the DECA chapter function in supplementing Marketing Education Programs.

ADVANTAGES TO MEMBERSHIP

Several advantages of student membership in DECA are:

- affiliation with students who have common job and career interests
- encouragement of individual and group initiative and effort on a competitive level
- a local chapter in which a member can learn, compete, and be eligible for state and national recognition
- stature in a job training station from an employer who recognizes, supports, and respects Marketing Education
- automatic subscription of the official DECA publication, published four times a year, and other items in the membership package
- informed about marketing and distribution, chapter news, and other special interest articles as they pertain to the membership
- scholarship awards programs which assist and encourage members to further their education
- membership in an organization which encourages civic responsibility and social awareness through professional conferences, chapter activities, school improvement projects, and support for the community activities
- many other membership features

GOVERNING BODIES AND SUPPORTING ORGANIZATIONS

- Any student enrolled in a Marketing Education instructional program is eligible for membership in local, state, and national DECA.
- DECA, Inc. is the adult governing body and legal controlling agency of DECA; composed of representatives of Marketing Education in all State Associations chartered by DECA.
- DECA Foundation is created to assist and encourage DECA members to continue career study in marketing and distribution. The DECA Foundation is governed by the Board of Directors.
- Board of Directors is composed of 13 members (10 of whom are from DECA, Inc., plus three appointed members) elected to set policy for National DECA and the DECA Foundation.
- National Advisory Board consists of organizations contributing financial support to DECA. Representatives serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of Directors.
- Program Council Members are appointed by the Board of Directors to research and present recommendations for competitive events.
- Diamond Club has a membership which is open to individuals or firms and available only through a State Association. This Club provides funds for the Program of Youth Activity in the area of Awards and Recognition, Leadership Conferences, Program Development, Leadership Training, Public Information, and Scholarships.
- The alumni division of DECA is a program that provides former DECA members an opportunity to continue association with DECA after graduation.
- Scholarship Awards are available to deserving members of DECA. They are intended to help members towards continuing their preparation for business or teaching careers in Marketing Education. They range in value depending upon the recipient's needs.

- The Oswald M. Hager Leadership Award is a financial award available to any DECA member who shows evidence of leadership ability and intends to complete a program of study at the University of North Dakota in Marketing Education.
